



THE STUDENT RIGHTS & RESPONSIBILITIES OFFICE: HOW WE CAN SUPPORT THOSE IMPACTED BY SEXUAL VIOLENCE AND/OR MISCONDUCT

➤ Accommodations

We can facilitate some possible course accommodation options such as assignment extensions or switching to another section of a course.

➤ Anonymous Reporting

We can inform you of anonymous reporting options.

➤ Empowerment

We can empower those impacted by sexual violence and/or misconduct to share their needs and choose how they would like their needs met.

➤ Community Resources

We can share resources for additional support.

➤ Reporting to the RCMP (Police)

We can answer questions about the process of making an official police report and/or a third-party report.

➤ Restorative Approaches

We can facilitate restorative dialogues by encouraging open communication, accountability, and empathy that may shed light on the ‘why’ of what has happened.

➤ Safety Planning

We can facilitate a connection to Campus Security for safety planning at KPU.

➤ KPU’s Policy SR14

We can provide guidance about KPU’s Sexual Violence and Misconduct policy and procedures (how to file a formal complaint and/or informal resolution options). Find all KPU policies at kpu.ca/policies

* A victim/survivor-centered approach is a way of engaging with victims/survivors that prioritizes listening, avoids re-traumatization, and systematically focuses on their safety, rights, well-being, expressed needs and choices. The purpose is to give back as much control to victims/survivors as feasible and ensure empathetic delivery of services in a non-judgmental manner while upholding fair due process for all.

** A trauma-informed approach to sexual violence refers to understanding the impacts of sexual violence on victims/survivors (and others) and responding in a manner that promotes their empowerment and recovery and minimizes re-traumatization.
