- Participated in the Scarborough Charter annual inter-institutional forum and executive meetings in Waterloo. Provost Purvey also attended.

- Submitted an annual report to the Scarborough Charter on KPU's EDI initiatives.
- KPU's efforts were recognized at the Scarborough Charter executive meeting.

Anti-Racism Initiatives:

- o Attended the National EDI-Anti-Racism Conference at Memorial University.
- o Participated in training with the Canadian Race Relations Foundation.
- o Gathered extensive information to inform KPU's policies and procedures.

Collaborations and New Developments:

Partnering with other institutions to develop policies and procedures.

- Working on developing Black studies and EDI citations in collaboration with the Office of the Provost and Faculty of Arts.
