I just returned from the Association for Authentic, Experiential and Evidence Based Learning (AAEEBL) Annual meeting. If you are not familiar with this organization, they partner with the Association of Colleges and Universities (AACU) to promote and support folio thinking and ePortfolio practices in higher education. If you are interested in folio thinking or reviewing literature on ePortfolio practices, check out their database which maintains a record of all relevant articles Publications on ePortfolio: Archives of the Research Landscape – AAEEBL. As a champion for our ePortolio platform Pebblepad,

and a strong believer in focusing on learning process over product, as well as the need for learners to develop their identity as individuals and professionals in their chosen field, this event was a gathering of my kind of educators. There were even presentations on the role of generative AI in ePortfolios and how it can be used as a support or collaborative tool in the folio thinking process. Most impactful were the Batson lecture presentation by Dr. Candyce Reynolds from Boise State University titled "Reflection is Our Most Transferable Skill", as well as the presentations by guest speakers from College Unbound, a local post-secondary institution dedicated to supporting non-traditional and primarily marginalized learners in their pursuit of higher education. These two institutions are designing from a very student-centred lens, reconsidering what we call essential skills and removing barriers for learners while simultaneously helping them to find their strengths, build resilience and develop a growth mindset moving them in the direction of lifelong learners who are community minded and taking action for change.

I am feeling inspired and ready to partner and dig into conversations about how we can change education for the better.
