St. Pölten is not only the oldest town in Austria, but also the capital city of Lower Austria. The long history of St. Pölten is reflected in the unique structure of the city. Many buildings in Baroque and Art Nouveau style characterise the old town and refer to the magnificent architecture of centuries long gone by. However, great present-day architects have also provided the city with modern buildings perfectly fitted into the townscape. This means that there is no strict separation between the present and the past. The city stretches to 108.48 km² with 52.145 inhabitants. It lies on the Traisen river. Located north of the Alps and south of the Wachau and is part of the Mostviertel, the southwestern region of Lower Austria. St. Pölten is located 66 km away from Vienna.

The culture and leisure time program in St. Pölten is very diverse and there are plenty of possibilities to discover the town every time anew. The FM4 Frequency Festival, known all around the world, takes place once a year in Austria and attracts high-class international artists.

St. Pölten perfectly combines the old cultural city with modern lifestyle. Modern buildings in the Landhausviertel district perfectly blend in the historic picture of the old town. Concerts, festivals and other cultural offers ensure that there is something for everyone. Many guests also find the State Museum of Lower Austria particularly interesting as it shows art, culture and nature alike. In summer, St. Pölten offers leisure time pleasures with the Viehofner lake and Ratzersdorfer lake in the middle of the city. Furthermore, there are sports facilities available for a relaxing day in the water.
