b. Dean's Report:

- Faculty of the Whole meeting is May 3rd please attend if you can!
 Theme this year will be about alignment (working with non-academic departments at KPU to better understand and align our activities with theirs)
- International Student situation update: we are keeping an eye on Summer enrolment; no huge unexpected red flags have arisen. But, we expected the hit to come in the fall. We are more concerned about the message about Canada as a place to study as opposed to the cap more concern lies in filling those seats available than what total seats we have.
- Working with chairs to improve ability to recruit. This has led to a really good start of a conversation with marketing to look at an overhaul of our website as a whole.
- Still in the works conversation about FSO regarding faculty or chairs being able to call
 potential students etc. If you would like to put your name forward to volunteer for this
 initiative, or if you know someone who would, please let Brett know.

c. Senate Reports:

February 20th:

- President Davis updated us on the changes to international admissions; watching for more details.
- Of particular interest to Science was the approval of the revisions to the Bachelor of Applied Science in Sustainable Agriculture, effective 01Sep 2024. Congrats to SustAg! There was also a consent agenda of courses from SSCC; no Science courses were included.
- A new list of graduates (to graduate in June) was approved. No other motions were made
- The Senate meeting was quite short. It was followed by Senate Engage, featuring the Entertainment Arts program.

- Received a report from Academic Integrity Office, they are also working on updating their resources for faculty and students.
- Turn-It-In Draft Coach is available for students and faculty with support provided by Teaching and Learning commons.
- New asynchronous moodle course training on restorative justice in dealing with academic integrity violations.
- Report from the Learning Centre asking for any recommendations on students you feel would make great Peer Tutors as our current group is graduating.

Research:

- The committee met with Daniel Bernstein (Arts), Bernadine Sengalrayan (Arts) and Victor Martinez (Design) on February 16th as part of their consultation leading to development of an updated research advancement strategy for KPU.
- Forwarded a synthesis of the results of the Faculty of Science Research Survey conducted in 2019 to Daniel, Bernardine, and Victor.
- Research currently has reps only from AGRI, MATH, PHYS and the research institutes. Reps from 2 more academic departments are needed.

5. New Business:

- Discussion to clarify the role of Faculty of Science Academic Planning and Priorities committee.
- Multidisciplinary space for student/faculty research as a priority.

6. Guest Discussion:

Senate Subcommittee on Research is overseeing the creation of a Research Advancement Strategy. We will be joined by Daniel Bernstein, Victor Martinez, and Bernadine Sengalrayan, who are soliciting input that will be used to formulate the strategy.

- SSCR hopes to have this report done in late April or early May with strategies to advance research at KPU. They have been meeting with various Faculty Councils and research committees for feedback.
- Faculty noted that they need funding, time, and space to do research. KPU has an
 inordinate amount of bureaucracy to get any of these. The group working on the research
 advancement strategy is planning to put together a few different models of how things
 might work, in order to balance out teaching, service, and research. Townhalls will be
 announced soon to provide another opportunity for input.
