



WHAT CAN I GRADUATE WITH?

What does "academic level" mean?

We offer a wide range of programs at KPU, and they all fall into one of the following levels: preparatory, undergraduate, graduate, and vocational. Within these levels, a program may be open intake or limited intake.

PREPARATORY PROGRAM

Specific post-secondary programs or courses below the bachelor's degree level that may offer their own credential and/or prepare you for vocational or undergraduate studies.

UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAM

Post-secondary education at the university or college level that includes either baccalaureate or post-baccalaureate course work.

GRADUATE PROGRAM

Post-secondary programs above the bachelor's degree level.

VOCATIONAL PROGRAMS

Programs that combine skills and knowledge specific to a particular industry or career, including apprenticeships, which blend inclass learning with time on the job working with an employer sponsor.

OPEN INTAKE:

These programs do not limit the number of students that are admitted in each application cycle.

LIMITED INTAKE:

These programs only accept a set number of students in each application cycle and may have additional admission requirements.


EDUCATION ASSISTANT

- Certificate (2 semesters)
- Education Assistants are important members of the educational team, supporting students with special and diverse learning needs from kindergarten through Grade 12 in BC schools
- There is a high demand for education assistants
- EDAS graduates are employed by all of the school districts in the Lower Mainland, Fraser Valley and beyond
- Education assistants work in both elementary and secondary schools in a variety of settings, including regular classrooms, resource rooms, work experience sites, and life-skills training

COMPUTER AIDED
DRAFTING AND DESIGN

- Diploma, 2 years full-time
- Co-Op available
- Starting in Fall 2021, the new CADD diploma program will provide students a choice between two specializations
- The Specialization in Architectural and Structural CADD, which will commence in September (Fall Term)
- The Specialization in Architectural and Mechanical CADD, which will commence in January (Spring Term)
- CADD/Drafting graduates may pursue a career in a variety of employment situations in architectural, engineering, manufacturing or municipal offices, or in a production /construction setting





FOUNDATIONS IN DESIGN CERTIFICATE

- Foundations in Design is a one-year (2-semester)
 certificate program that will develop your skills and your
 understanding of design as a career.
- Study fundamental design skills such as drawing, 2D and 3D design plus develop methods in the creative process essential to your success.
- Complete your year with a dynamic portfolio of work that will open the door to future studies in any number of design disciplines.

APPLIANCE SERVICING TECHNICIAN

- The Appliance Service Technician: Certificate program prepares students for entry into the appliance service and repair industry.
- 39 week full-time program.
- Students complete all of the in school training required for red seal qualifications and develop their skills thorough hands-on opportunities.
- Students also acquire a sound knowledge of common appliance systems and essential skills necessary to succeed in the industry.
- Graduates of the program are successfully employed as technicians, owners, managers, and technical trainers in the appliance industry. Commercial cooking servicing, vending machine repair, furnace and fireplace service sector, as well as other "electromechanical" occupations are also open to graduates.

Identify your current knowledge, abilities, and future needs for placement in an appropriate math course. Math testing is not used for admissions requirements, only as prerequisites for courses.



SUBMIT TRANSCRIPTS

WHAT TO SUBMIT

Official transcripts for all secondary and post-secondary institutions they have attended


• Examples: high school, college, universities and learning institutes

Visit the Students Application Checklist (<u>kpu.ca/oss</u>) to keep track of all the documents they must submit.

WAYS TO SUBMIT

- Mailed directly from the issuing institution in a sealed envelop
- In person in an institutionally sealed envelope
- Online through Student Transcripts Service (<u>studenttranscripts.gov.bc.ca</u>)





SUBMIT TRANSCRIPTS

OUT OF COUNTRY DOCUMENTS


Official transcripts must be issued by the educational institution in a sealed envelope bearing the original institutional seal, stamp or signature.

DO NOT SUBMIT opened transcripts, photocopies, faxed copies, and certified/notarized copies.

Third party evaluations, such as those provided by credential evaluation services, are not official documents and will not be accepted.

RECEIVE OFFER AND PAY DEPOSIT

RECEIVING AN OFFER OF ADMISSION

KPU Admissions will only evaluate you file after the application checklist is complete. If you are accepted, you will be mailed an offer of admission letter that informs you on what steps to take next.

ACCEPTING AN OFFER OF ADMISSION

You must accept your offer by the deadline indicated in the letter and pay a non-refundable confirmation deposit as part of your acceptance.
