




#### >>> Department Headcounts




#### >>> Full-Time Equivalent (FTE)










## What ACP Students Tell Us - 2023 Student Satisfaction Survey


Of the 125 eligible ACP students registered in fall 2023, 33 (26%) participated in the annual survey.
