- 1. Ron Jeffels, Principal of Okanagan College, welcomed the Committee.
- 2. The minutes of the meeting of 18 October 1979 were approved.
- 3. <u>Correspondence</u>: Bob Rennie, chairman of the Math Articulation Committee, suggests that the chairmen of the articulation committees meet to discuss matters common to all committees funding of articulation meetings, second-year enrollments, the impact of the Open Learning Institute, presentations to Academic Council, etc.
- 4. Mike Daniels, President of the BC Social Studies Teachers' Association, explained the process and goals of the K-11 Social Studies curriculum revision. Committee members objected to the revision's jargon, fuzzy concepts, and lack of specific references to the discipline of history. Mr. Daniels invited us to forward our views to Ian Parker, Curriculum Development Branch, Department of Education, Victoria. Mike also suggested we communicate regularly with the Social Studies Teachers' Association and with the Social Studies groups in the college districts in which we work, that we become members of the BCSSTS and contribute to its publication Horizon, and that we assist Social Studies teachers, among whom there are a number of "non-specialists," to stay abreast of historical scholarship by offering workshops and the like.
