

New Faculty Checklist - Academic Integrity

 1. Watch the <u>Intro to Policy ST2 Video</u> to learn about academic integrity at KPU Review <u>Policy ST2, Student Academic Integrity</u>
 2. Update your course syllabus to include an Academic Integrity Section with links to Policy ST2, resources, as well as information about your expectations when it comes to Gen AI. Review KPU's Position Statement on Academic Integrity and Artificial Intelligence Technology Review the Syllabus Statements for Artificial Intelligence resource
 3. Review the assessments in your course and consider if any of them could benefit from being redesigned to reduce the opportunity for academic misconduct and to support stronger student learning. The <u>Teaching & Learning Commons</u> can help with this. Review the upcoming <u>Teaching & Learning events and workshops</u>
 4. Ensure the instructions for your assignments are clear and explicit about what is permitted. Review the <u>Assessment Design Tips to Promote Academic Integrity</u> resource
5. Ensure your course materials (e.g. slides) are role modeling academic integrity and include <u>citations/references</u> where applicable
6. Consider including the <u>Introduction to Academic Integrity Tutorial</u> as part of your course
7. Consider <u>requesting a short presentation</u> from the Academic Integrity Unit for your class at the beginning of the semester
8. Consider having incentives (e.g. bonus marks) to encourage students to attend <u>Learning</u> <u>Centre workshops</u> and events (e.g. <u>Academic Integrity Week</u>)
9. Bookmark the <u>Academic Integrity Resource Shelf</u> and explore the resources within it
 10. Plan how you are going to bring up integrity in your course and what resources you would like to share. The KPU <u>Library</u> and <u>Learning Centres</u> offer short presentations/tours of their services that can be integrated into your class Consider how integrity/ethics shows up in your discipline and look for ways that you can integrate into your classes the theme of integrity throughout the semester
