## IMMERSE YOURSELF IN THE WORLD OF GENERATIVE AI

#### **GETTING STARTED**

Microsoft Copilot is a Generative AI included in Microsoft products. It serves as your everyday companion offering a conversational chat interface with many capabilities. It includes information retrieval, text generation, and image creation.

Logging in through your KPU account ensures your data is private and not being used by Microsoft to enhance their machine learning algorithm and advertisements.

Copilot is powered by OpenAl's GPT 3.5 and GPT4, so it is among the most powerful GenAls currently available. Copilot is continually evolving so its features, access and interface may change over time. Currently, Copilot is available as a website or as a sidebar in the Microsoft Edge web browser. Open Microsoft Edge and click the icon ( ) in the top righthand corner. Currently, Copilot does not require an account or additional account or login to access.

#### JOIN THE COMMUNITY OF PRACTICE

#### **GEN AI PROOF YOUR RUBRIC**

We're launching support for rubric development for Gen Al considerations! The team in the T&L Commons will be available to provide feedback on assessment rubric design to "GenAl proof" it. The feedback will focus on supporting instructors to refine their rubric to ensure it evaluates integrated learning, which is not easily replicated by GenAl: Criteria labels, rating scale or performance levels, indicators for each performance level/criteria.




