	Students can only choose modules from one course and must take all compulsory modules taught in the semester of enrolment.		
	Teaching, studio and learning hours are course-specific and consist of both in and out-of-class activities.		
	The course catalogue for the next academic year is updated in June every year.		
Standard	A full-time student at UCA must complete 120 UCA credits / 60 ECTS per academic		
Full-Time	year. UCA academic years consist of two semesters.		
Workload	An exchange student must enrol in a full-time course load of at least 60 ECTS per semester.		
	Students must maintain solid attendance and complete all coursework.		
Credit Transfer	On completion, students can request an interim transcript from the UCA campus registry. An official transcript will be provided post-examination board approval. The examination board occurs once a year at the end of the academic year. This usually is June or July.

ACCOMMODATION

VISA INFORMATION

Depending on the country of origin and the length of study, the student may require a visa to enter and study in the UK.

Visitor Visa - Exchange placements for up-to 6 months

For exchange periods less than 6 months, students can come to the UK on a visitor visa. Students are not permitted to work on this visa including unpaid internships.

If Students are a visa national (see visa national list) then you will need to apply in advance for a Visitor visa and can only travel to the UK once your visa has been granted.

If Students are national of the EU/EEA, Australia, Canada, Japan, New Zealand, Singapore, South Korea or the USA, you will be granted a visitor visa on entry.

Please note the study rights to this visa can not be extended. If a student wishes to extend their study at UCA for a period over six months, the student will be required to depart the UK and apply for a student route visa before returning.

Student Route Visa - Exchange placement over six months

Students coming to the UK for more than six months will need to apply for a Student Route visa, which will be issued by the UCA International Admissions team and must be granted before arrival in the UK.

If at any time, students decide to reduce their period of study. In that case, the University will notify the UK Visas and Immigration (UKVI) Department of the Home Office of a course's alternation and earlier departure date. The UKVI would then curtail (shorten) students' visas to be in line with the new study period.

On a Student Route visa, students would be permitted to work 20 hours per week in the UK during term time and full time during official vacation periods. Please note that there are a number of restrictions on the types of work that you could do on a Student Route visa; for more information, please see the UK Council for International Student Affairs (UKCISA) website for more information.
